© COPYRIGHT INFORMATION

Federal law requires that all colleges and universities provide their students with the following information in regards to United States Copyright law. Violations of US Copyright law are serious and carry stiff penalties/consequences. Employees and students who are unsure as to whether they are violating copyright law will be directed to the U.S. Copyright Office's website at <http://www.copyright.gov/>. Students and employees are encouraged to visit the U.S. Copyright Office's website for additional information on this important topic.

Copyright infringement is the act of exercising, without permission or legal authority, one or more of the exclusive rights granted to the copyright owner under section 106 of the Copyright Act (Title 17 of the United States Code). These rights include the right to reproduce or distribute a copyrighted work. In the file-sharing context, downloading or uploading substantial parts of a copyrighted work without authority constitutes an infringement.

Penalties for copyright infringement include civil and criminal penalties. In general, anyone found liable for civil copyright infringement may be ordered to pay either actual damages or "statutory" damages affixed at not less than \$750 and not more than \$30,000 per work infringed. For "willful" infringement, a court may award up to \$150,000 per work infringed. A court can, in its discretion, also assess costs and attorneys' fees. For details, see Title 17, United States Code, Sections 504, 505. Willful copyright infringement can also result in criminal penalties, including imprisonment of up to five years and fines of up to \$250,000 per offense.

Any student that is suspected of such a violation will be immediately subjected to an investigation. If the investigation shows that the student did violate US Copyright law, the student will be subject to discipline up to and including dismissal from TGA Truck Driving School.
